


#### **Overall Satisfaction of LRPOA Communications**




#### **Current LRPOA Communications - Value**

# Al Summary of Comments – Top 5 themes:

- Limited Participation Due to Time and Residency: Many respondents express that their ability to participate in events and clubs is restricted by full-time work, part-time residency, or busy schedules. Several mention looking forward to greater involvement after retirement or when they can spend more time at the lake.
- **Desire for More Inclusive and Diverse Offerings:** Comments highlight a need for events and activities that cater to a broader demographic, especially younger members and families. There are concerns that current offerings are primarily geared toward retirees, with suggestions to diversify event timing and content to foster a more multigenerational community.
- Positive Feedback on Events and Community Spirit: Several participants praise the variety and creativity of activities, the success of specific events like the garage sale, and the opportunity for social connection. Appreciation is expressed for organizers and the sense of community fostered by these events.
- Suggestions for Event Improvements: Respondents offer constructive suggestions such as improving the boat parade route, forming committees for specific activities like pickleball, and introducing new event types (e.g., electric car learning event, remote worker networking). Some note disappointment with aspects like event judging or participation.
- Interest in Volunteering and Future Involvement: A number of comments indicate willingness to volunteer or take on planning roles in the future, particularly as personal circumstances change. Some express gratitude for current organizers and a desire to contribute when able.
